Usually, I talk about staying connected to our EBA community. This month the message must be to "Be the Fix," practice social distancing and stay 6 feet apart. In accordance with the Indiana Supreme Court Order-Vanderburgh County Courts, the EBA has canceled events including scheduled in-person CLEs through April 20 and Law Day, and closed its doors to the public. However, the EBA community continues to work hard to provide services for its members. Staff is working remotely with committees and members to provide information and CLE that are relevant to our clients and practices during the current health and economic crises. Need to Know About Families First Coronavirus Response Act</u>. On April 2, Andy Ozete, Farmer Scott Robinson & Schmitt, and Bob Musgrave, Chapter 13 Trustee will present <u>Bankruptcy in the Time of COVID</u>. In the coming weeks, the EBA will continue to try to provide whatever resources you need to help your practice during this time. Please let us know what you need.

Many of us are understandably experiencing some degree of anxiety and stress as we navigate through information and experiences that are changing daily and sometimes hourly. There are resources available to help. The Judges and Lawyers Assistance Program (317-833-0370) is available between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. with well-trained JLAP staff members ready to discuss stressors you may be facing, especially as life has changed so drastically. There are also JLAP support discussion groups available, including a new group designed for those feeling isolated as a result of the stay-at-home order, that connects every Wednesday at noon to share concerns and support. CLE FAQ Indiana CLE Requirements

What are Indiana's Continuing Legal Education (CLE) requirements?

Attorneys and judges are required to complete no less than six (6) hours of approved CLE each year and at least thirtysix (36) hours of approved CLE per three-year educational period. Also, attorneys and judges are required to take at least three (3) hours of ethics credit anytime within the three -year educational period.

Can non-legal subject matter (NLS) courses receive credit?

Yes. NLS courses are courses that are not substantively legal, but enhance your competence in your individual practice. An attorney may report a maximum of twelve (12) hours of NLS credit per three-year cycle. An attorney may report any or all of the twelve (12) allowable NLS hours in a single course or a given year.

Can distance education courses receive credit?

Yes. Distance education courses are CLE courses that do not require a student to be in the same location as the instructor and do not require an attendant to be at the learning site to monitor your attendance. No more than eighteen (18) hours of CLE in the three-year educational period requirement shall be filled through interactive distance education.
