PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

THE MAKINGS OF A GOOD LAWYER: COMMUNICATION

Over the next twelve months, I am honored to serve as President of the Evansville Bar Association. As a result, it is now my duty to draft twelve articles for the Summation. Given the finite amount of wit that I possess, I thought I'd write on the personal qualities and characteristics that I believe make a good lawyer. This subject matter should give me enough fodder with which to fill a year's worth of rambling, and hopefully will not come off as a lecture from the pulpit of my limited experience.



The first quality of a good lawyer is the ability to communicate effectively. Sounds simple enough, but when you think of the diverse audiences to whom we speak or write, it can be a daunting task to make your communication entertaining, credible, and educational... especially if the legal concepts you are talking about are complex. A jury of six in Southern Indiana may consist of a farmer, a nurse, a stay at home mom or dad, a college professor, a twenty-year-old social media influencer, and an over the road trucker. These six may not communicate in the same way, and may not use the same grammar or vernacular. They may come from opposite sides of the political spectrum, and they certainly will have differing day-to-day concerns in life. However, your role as a lawyer is to keep their attention on the subject matter and to persuade them to see your client's side of the story.

Even if you are not a trial lawyer, your clients may be just as varied. As their lawyer, you have to communicate in the client's language to give them the best understanding of what legal options they may have in a given transaction or legal scenario. And it is your job to alter your communication in the way they understand the best. Either way, whether it is in court, or on the phone, or by written word, or across the table, a critical skill for today's lawyer is his or her ability to communicate.

It's much the same as an IT professional trying to manage the expectations of a mid-size law firm. One lawyer is proficient in Office programs, while others struggle to be able to turn their computer on in the morning. As the IT professional, you are charged with picking firm-wide computer programs that each is able to use. In the same way, lawyers have to be able to communicate in a way that his or her audience can understand, regardless of their varying competency.

One has to use the ability to effectively communicate to entertain like **Scott Wylie**, educate like **Marco DeLucio**, and persuade like **Dennis Brinkmeyer**. Obviously, this list of skilled communicators is not exhaustive...we are proud as a bar association to have many good communicators among our ranks. But you get the point. Good lawyers have the ability to effectively communicate to both advocate for his or her client, or to effectively provide the legal options for the client to be best informed in making their legal decisions.

The Volunteer Lawyer Program was recently awarded a Community Good Grant by the Vanderburgh Community Foundation to support VLP's Second Chance and Debt Legal Service Clinic. This will help VLP to continue to provide this service to indigent individuals seeking to overcome barriers to employment and stable living situations.

The Second Chance and Debt Clinic is held the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month from 11am to 1pm Central Time in the Vanderburgh County Law Library. The clinic offers legal assistance to individuals who cannot afford a lawyer with driver's license issues, expungement, general debt issues, eviction issues such as eviction sealing, and other similar civil legal matters. The clinic takes walk-ins and is a good place to navigate our community members who may need help with these issues.

Like many of VLP's clinics, the Second Chance and Debt Clinic is administered to be compliant with Indiana's Rules of Professional Conduct to limit potential conflicts to allow volunteers to provide brief legal services without creating conflict of interest issues for themselves or their firms. Legal volunteers are always welcome and encouraged to assist at VLP's clinics. VLP offers support, training, and malpractice insurance for volunteers.
