## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

### TAKE A STEP BACK TO HELP AVOID BURNOUT

I'm writing this article on a rainy Sunday afternoon having just returned from a great vacation where, with apologies to Zac Brown, "the only worry in the world is the tide going to reach my chair." Of course that wasn't exactly true, and I suspect that for many of us it never is. The requirements of our practices and commitments follow us wherever we go. Perhaps that's why in part that *Bloomberg Law* reported last month that lawyer burnout is rising. Ironically both feelings of not having enough work and having too much to do exacerbate the situation.



Another contributing factor according to *Bloomberg Law* may be the number of hours worked per week. It turns out that lawyers who work significantly longer hours than others tend to be more dissatisfied than their peers with their jobs. In turn, those who are unsatisfied with their jobs experience job burnout more frequently. No matter what, there is no doubt that being a lawyer can be very stressful. Young lawyers struggle with adjusting to the demands of a professional career. As we get older, we face the struggles of building a practice and client relationships. As we get older yet, we are challenged by further practice, client management and administrative responsibilities. Of course, we do all of this while trying to provide good value and sound counsel to our clients. We are challenged by the practice to work very long hours to meet the needs of the latest crisis, get the important brief on file or get the deal closed by the end of the quarter.

In many cases, burnout is a problem coupled with an inability to disconnect from work. The thing is, we are all in the same boat together. I have now worked at both a large (for Evansville) and a small firm. While the challenges are somewhat different, people are still very understanding of the need to be able to step away and unplug. I also think that our clients understand this need. As pressures rise for them, they have become more understanding of their own needs to be able to step away from work. When I explain to clients who call that I am on a week's family vacation, they invariably apologize for disturbing me and tell me that we can talk about whatever the issue is when I return to town. Opposing counsel are even very understanding of avoiding deadlines during a vacation.

So, as we are in the height of summer vacation season, I encourage you if at all possible to "put the world away for a minute." Step away from your practice and unplug. This year, for the first time, I did not bring my phone with me to the beach. I was able to spend a few hours a day with friends and family away from the beast that is the constant demand of being a lawyer, and it was wonderful. I hope that everyone at some point during the year has the opportunity to step away from the grind for at least a while. It is important for our wellbeing to step away and recharge. Your colleagues and your clients really will understand.
