PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

THE MAKINGS OF A GOOD LAWYER: UPHOLDING THE JUDICIARY

Like most attorneys, there have been times in my past when I questioned an order from the Court. I may have felt like the presiding judge missed a fact, or otherwise didn't give the same weight to some evidence that I had. It should come as no surprise that our judges are fallible...they are human beings after all. But I can honestly say that far more often are the times where I felt that a judge's ruling was squarely correct (even if not in my favor).



As officers of the Court and as part of one of the three branches of government, it is the duty of every attorney to uphold the judiciary. In fact, in the preamble to our ethical rules, it is stated, "A lawyer should demonstrate respect for the legal system and for those who serve it, including judges, other lawyers and public officials. While it is a lawyer's duty, when necessary, to challenge the rectitude of official action, it is also a lawyer's duty to uphold legal process."

This is especially important right now. Three of our Indiana Supreme Court Justices are up for a retention vote in this election cycle. Chief Justice Loretta Rush, Justice Mark Massa, and Justice Derek Molter are all subject to retention votes in November. There has been initiated a specific campaign to have these three Justices removed from the Court. Regardless of whether you, as a lawyer, are ultimately in favor of retention or not, I think it is incumbent upon all lawyers to correct misunderstanding of the public when faced with it.

In this case, the campaign to have these Justices removed is largely due to their ruling in Members of the Medical Licensing Board of Indiana v. Planned Parenthood Great Northwest, denying a preliminary injunction of Indiana's abortion law. Some members of the public believe that our judges legislate from the bench. In reality, the Indiana Supreme Court in this case upheld a law passed by the Indiana Legislature, denying a requested preliminary injunction in the enactment and enforcement of that law. In doing so, our Supreme Court did exactly what they are supposed to do, upholding the rule of law regardless of their personal beliefs on the subject matter of the litigation.

In reality, Justices Rush, Massa, and Molter have been exemplary. Indiana's Supreme Court is often cited to and looked highly upon by the Courts of other States and Nationally. Chief Justice Rush, while being our first female Supreme Court Chief Justice, is well respected for her expansion of problem-solving courts, the establishment of the commercial courts in Indiana, and her efforts combating the opioid crisis through the court system. Justice Mark Massa has expertise in constitutional law. Both his and Justice Derek Molter's work on the Court has helped Indiana, and all Hoosiers, to obtain well-reasoned, reliable, and precedential decisions.

As officers of the Court, I invite all of you to read the above case, understand it, and correct the misleading narrative that is being used against the Justices. No matter what side of the debate you are on, it is our responsibility to correct misinformation when it relates to our judiciary.

LIBRARIAN'S CORNER: FAMILY LAW CLINIC, PRO SE CLINIC, AND HELP DESK

As you know, the law library hosts legal clinics operated by the Volunteer Lawyer Program/Pro Bono Indiana (VLP/PBI). The Family Law Clinic meets on the first and third Thursday of each month from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for scheduled appointments. The *Pro Se* Clinic meets on the second and fourth Thursdays from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and offers walk-in litigants assistance with questions about their legal needs. In addition, self-represented litigants may stop by the daily in-person help desk from 8:00 to 9:00 a.m. in the William H. Miller Law Library.

This partnership between VLP/PBI and the law library helps make it possible for self-represented litigants involved in civil matters to receive guidance on how to successfully navigate the court system, obtain appropriate *pro se* pleadings, access self-help materials, and take advantage of online legal resources. 

At the recent Judicial Conference, Hon. Mary Margaret Lloyd was recognized for 24 years of service on the bench.


Magistrate Molly Briles completed 120 hours of education presented by the Indiana Office of Court Services to receive the Indiana Judicial College certificate.
