PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Philanthropy in the Evansville Bar Association

VLP News

VLP was able to attend the ISBA's annual meeting in October. First, thank you to Steve Hoar for serving as Chair of the ISBA House of Delegates this year and for representing Indiana as our State Delegate in the ABA's House of Delegates.

As you may know, Indiana has an attorney shortage. Per reports and outlook data obtained by our State Judiciary, State Bar Association, and other stakeholders in our legal future, this shortage looks to continue or worsen as practicing attorneys retire and not enough new attorneys are in Indiana filling the need for local legal issues. This means that fewer Hoosiers are able to get necessary legal services for common issues in their communities. Those with lower incomes are often the first to experience the additional costs associated with lack of legal service inability to see through outcomes or lack of fair outcomes due to difficulties navigating legal systems. Our legal aid programs, and our courts, directly experience the impact of this need. It stretches thin resources and makes it harder to provide adequate care and services to everyone.

The ISBA held a CLE at our Evansville Bar Association outlining a few proposals to address this issue that have come from our Court's Commission on Indiana's Legal Future. While the success of these initiatives is not certain,

the need is. There was a clear call at the annual meeting this year for our collective service to help with this issue. Service to address need by volunteering to do pro bono work, to educate community members, or to mentor younger attorneys or students interested in law. Civil legal aid systems have long experienced high demand, but if demand continues to grow and our current systems are not able to respond, then what we may see are less healthy communities. To assist in your service, you have VLP. We have many opportunities to get engaged to provide services to those in need. With your help, we can begin to respond and address these needs. We are thankful for your help in making our community a little better.

Regarding the John L. Sanders-Evansville Bar Foundation, I write to remind us to be thankful

Foundation, I write to remind us to be thankful for Evelyn Sanders and John Sanders, wife and husband. John was an attorney who in 1923 commenced a practice in Evansville and continued to practice until one day prior to his date of death in 1997—at 100 years of age. Evelyn survived him and decided to establish a memorial foundation in John's honor. She began the endowing process in 1997; and the EBF was created in 1999. Its statement of purpose, "Promoting Justice and Improving Lives Through the Law," had been exemplified by John's 75 years of practice. Evelyn passed away in 2007 the age of 98.

I was fortunate to know John and witness him practice law since our careers overlapped, although he had been tailing in the vineyards of the law for over 50 years before I started. He was professional and created clever ways for him to deliver legal services.

John was a well-rounded gentleman. His bright mind was engaged in areas other than the law. One area was art, particularly painting. He operated an art supply store aptly named The Artists Market. I was attending the University of Evansville when the trend arrived here for folks of my generation to wear hippie garb. One item of the hippie uniform was bell-bottom jeans. At first the only local store which sold them was The Artists Market. John had been in other areas of the United States, had observed the trend in clothing among the young, was openminded and astute, and got ahead of that trend in his own city.

LIBRARIAN'S CORNER: FAMILY LAW CLINIC, PRO SE CLINIC. AND HELP DESK

As you know, the law library hosts legal clinics operated by the Volunteer Lawyer Program/Pro Bono Indiana (VLP/PBI). The Family Law Clinic meets on the first and third Thursday of each month from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. for scheduled appointments. The *Pro Se* Clinic meets on the second and fourth Thursdays from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and offers walk-in litigants assistance with questions about their legal needs. In addition, self-represented litigants may stop by the daily in-person help desk from 8:00 to 9:00 a.m. in the William H. Miller Law Library.

This partnership between VLP/PBI and the law library helps make it possible for self-represented litigants involved in civil matters to receive guidance on how to successfully navigate the court system, obtain appropriate *pro se* pleadings, access self-help materials, and take advantage of online legal resources. Your generous donations and ongoing commitment to the Law Library Foundation and the law library ensure that the people in this community have access to these legal services and *pro se* clinics. 
